TO HONOR AND SERVE away well from the starting gate, nibbled against the bit as the rider gradually worked his way towards the inside, tucked along the rail after almost completing a quarter of a mile, was rated on the lead, with the runner up applying mild pressure, continued along on the same scenario until approaching the quarter pole, spurted away to a sizeable advantage once let out in upper stretch, then maintained a safe winning margin being hand encouraged to the finish line. MUCHO MACHO MAN broke on top, made his way, in a tight-packed field, towards the opening bend in the two path, was clipped from behind by BANDBOX approaching the mile marker, rated kindly along the outside soon after settling into the backstretch, kept a watchful on the leader, with the rider attempting to keep something in reserve, failed to match the top one's acceleration of speed turning for home, continued onward willingly nonetheless, narrowed in leaving the furlong grounds to be second best. MOUNTAIN TOWN hit the left side at the start, was placed under a snug hold towards the two path leaving the homestretch, steadied off heels, as the top one crossed over to the inside nearing the seven-eighths pole, recovered and tracked that one from the outside, was put to encouragement nearing the five-sixteenths pole, drafted behind MUCHO MACHO MAN swinging into the stretch, tipped out an additional path in upper stretch, but proved no match for the top twosome during the stretch run. BANDBOX tightly wedged between rivals, steadied when placed in tight quarters nearing the end of the run around the opening bend, clipping heels with a rival as well, emerged into the backstretch, in the three path, rated kindly from there for nearly three-quarters, steadily tired thereafter. BUFFUM ducked in at the break, raced along the inside, steadied when in tight quarters approaching the mile marker and again nearing the backstretch, continued to take the inside route, was coaxed along to keep up departing the backstretch, and tired.
