TO HONOR AND SERVE went three to four wide on the first turn, moved up with six furlongs to run, tracked the pace on the outside, ranged up while three wide on the far turn, gained the lead just inside the quarter-pole, was asked after straightening for the drive, disposed of RULE in upper stretch, came under a right-handed whip near the furlong marker, was switched to a left-handed whip when threatened by MUCHO MACHO MAN outside the sixteenth-pole, drifted out significantly under continued left hand urging, carried out MUCHO MACHO MAN in the process and just held. MUCHO MACHO MAN bumped with GOURMET DINNER at the start, was last away in the compact field, settled off the inside, was asked early on the far turn, dropped to the rail near the three-eighths pole, moved through on the inside of TRICKMEISTER, followed RULE while cutting the corner into the stretch, shifted out outside the three-sixteenths pole, rallied under a right-handed whip, drew alongside TO HONOR AND SERVE approaching the sixteenth-pole, was carried out several paths by that rival late and couldn't get by. CEASE angled in at the rear of the field, was reserved at the back while saving ground, remained patient while moving closer on the far turn, was given his cue near the five-sixteenths pole, angled out sharply in upper stretch, was forced further out when rivals to his inside were fanned out, losing valuable momentum in the process, moved in while under a drive in the final furlong and finished willingly for the show. TRICKMEISTER tracked the early pace while off the inside, moved up near the three-quarter pole to dispute the pace, vied off the rail on the far turn, chased into the stretch, was forced out nearing the three-sixteenths pole, brushed with STAY THIRSTY at that point, pursued the winner into the final furlong and tired. STAY THIRSTY went three wide on the first turn, settled off the pace, came under some urging near the five-eighths pole, was urged along while three to four wide on the far turn, raced within striking range turning into the stretch, brushed with TRICKMEISTER and was forced out near the three-sixteenths pole, had the rider get his whip knocked out of his hand in the vicinity of the furlong marker and lacked the needed response. RULE went to the front, set the pace on the inside, was challenged near the three-quarter pole, continued in front while along the rail, came under urging on the far turn, was asked for more near the five-sixteenths, lost the lead just inside the quarter-pole, dropped back under a drive and gave way. GOURMET DINNER was restless in the gate, bumped with MUCHO MACHO MAN at the start, saved ground on the initial turn, settled towards the rear, came under the whip with a half-mile to run and faltered.
